-On the 23 of June in 2016 51,9% voted to leave the EU in a UK referendum.



-The UK will be leaving the EU in March of 2019.

-The UK joined the European Communities on the first of January 1973.

-Prime Minister Theresa May announced that the UK would not seek permanent membership of the single market or the customs union after leaving the EU and promised to repeal the European Communities Act of 1972 and incorporate existing European Union Law into UK domestic law. Negotiations with the EU officially started in June 2017.

-Brexit is a portmanteau of British and exit. It was derived by analogy from Grexit referring to a hypothetical withdrawal of Greece from the eurozone.
